She stated that she has witnessed how our Sheriff's office has a very humane and person-centered philosophy, but there are still a lot of problems in the justice realm. She said these issues have been ongoing for years and there are still problems. She said it is time to stop police brutality and the people who are demanding equality have a very good reason to be protesting. She quoted activist Franklin Thomas. She said she hopes change will come peacefully.

Commissioner Sharpe stated that the Commissioners agree with those comments and the Board is committed to working within the County and the Sheriff's department to live up to high standards and to do their right things for all people.

There being no other business before the Board, Commissioner Baker adjourned the meeting at 9:15 a.m.
