

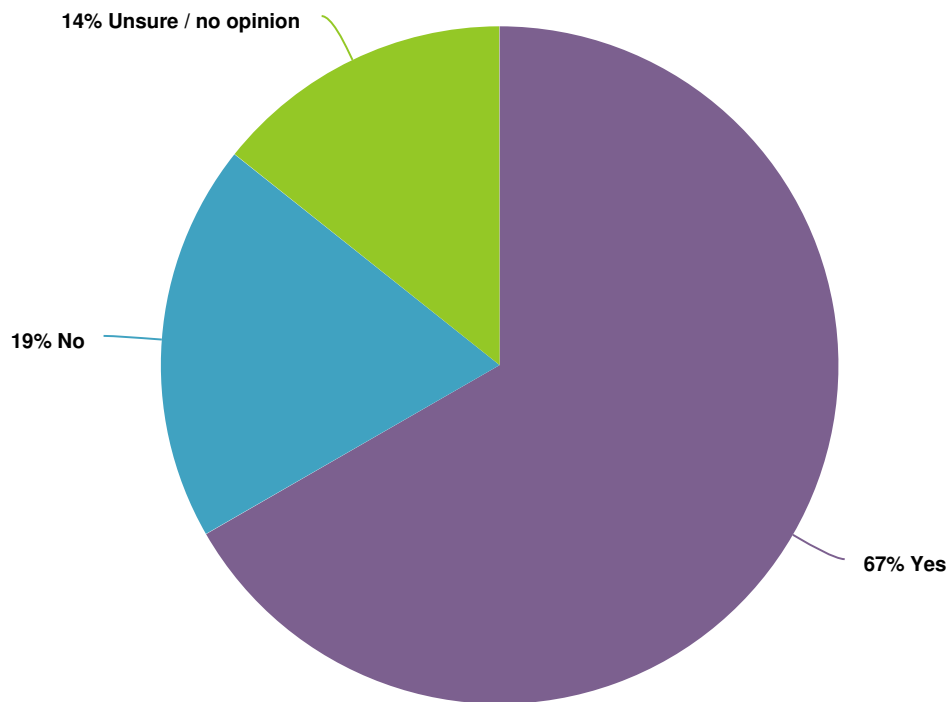

4 The fact that there are two dog parks but the playground appears small. There are a lot of children in the area, please make sure the playground is big with several play structures/equipment. The park on Florida near the highline trail is AWESOME yet feels a bit limited on play equipment.

11 I feel the landscape buffer between the park and the Alton Park neighborhood to the north, is woefully inadequate. The homes that back directly onto the park, unfortunately, are ridiculously close to that property edge. In your visual rendering, the trees providing that buffer on the west end of the park are way too sparse, especially since that's the area of greatest activity in the park. At least on the eastern end of the park, there is landscape grading plus trees, which helps separate the park from its northern neighbors. Will there be any kind of additional park fencing on that northern edge? It might help. The other issue is that it appears that there is inadequate seating in the park. Providing many more benches throughout the area, and more along the main path, would make a big difference! Many parks have that problem, and it doesn't serve their constituents well. Thank you for considering these important ideas.
