What is Colorado Life Trak?

In 2004, the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office began a collaboration of public and private entities to create what would become the Colorado Life Trak Program.

The Colorado Life Trak Program was designed to offer peace of mind for families of those who suffer mental disorders which can create the desire to wander from their homes.

Using specially designed transmitters and tracking devices, the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office has the ability to locate, within minutes, someone who has wandered from their home.

Who is Colorado Life Trak For?

The Colorado Life Trak Program is only for people who have a mental disability creating the tendency to wander, such as Alzheimer's, Dementia, Down Syndrome, Autism, Prader-Willi and various brain injuries. Additionally, participants in the program must have a daily caregiver living with them.

How does the program work?

- Participants are issued a FREE wristband transmitter that they wear 24 hours a day.
- In the event that the participant wanders, the caretaker should immediately notify the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office.
- The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office will dispatch specially trained locators with tracking devices that can locate the frequency of the transmitter worn by the participant.
- Once the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office has started the search using this technology, the average time to locate someone who has gone missing is under 30 minutes.



Proven benefits

- Most wanderers are found in under 30 minutes once the search has been started using this equipment.
- People can be tracked day or night, regardless of weather conditions.
- Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office has a 100% recovery rate.
- Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office is the state administering agency and has trained several other jurisdictions around the Denver Metro area.
