SAFETY TIPS - PREVENT VEHICLE BREAK-INS

The Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office wants to work with you to prevent or reduce criminal activity. Thefts from motor vehicles are crimes in which thieves take valuables from parked cars. You can significantly reduce your chance of becoming a victim by following a few simple tips.

IF YOU SEE IT, REPORT IT!

Non-emergency: 303-795-4711

WHERE YOU PARK

- Whenever possible, park your vehicle in a closed and locked garage.
- Park in a well-lit area. Proper lighting can deter thieves and help you safely enter and exit your vehicle.
- Park in an area with good visibility.
- Lock your vehicle even if you're parked in a gated or secure area. Thieves are counting on you to not lock up.

WHEN YOU PARK

- Always roll up your windows and lock your doors when you park.
- Remove anything from your vehicle that has personal information that identifies you. Vehicle maintenance receipts, store receipts, checks or anything with your name, address and phone number can provide enough information for a thief to commit identity theft.
- Remove your garage door opener, if possible, when parking outside of your home so you don't risk being a victim of burglary.
- Remove valuables when parking overnight.
- Packages and bags with store logos can be inviting targets. Secure them in the trunk, hide or remove them.

- NEVER assume someone else has already reported the behavior.
